Introduction



At St Agnes' we will do anything to keep students safe. The school helps and looks after all students; old and young, students with different beliefs and different backgrounds. The school has many ways to keep us safe.



Purpose



The teachers have committed to keep children safe. This means that the students at the school feel safe and not worried or scared that something bad will happen to them. The teachers and staff in the school know what to do if a student says that they feel unsafe or worried about anything.



Commitment to Child Safety

All students and young people attending St Agnes School have the right to feel safe.

The school tolerates no bullying or any kind of unsafe behaviour.





Risk Management



St Agnes' Primary School knows that it is important to keep our school safe.

The school looks for problems or things that might be unsafe and then if there are any problems the school will fix them straight away.

We should always tell someone if we see a risk.



Code of Conduct



St Agnes' Primary School makes sure there is a Code of Conduct for all teachers, aides, receptionists, Fr Alan, emergency teachers, parent helpers, other volunteers and workers that clearly explains the behaviour that they need to show.

This Code of Conduct is available on the school website and in the office.



Hiring Staff and Staff Training



Before employing staff and helpers, St Agnes' checks the background to see if the person is suitable to work with children.

Some of the things the school does to make sure they are right for the school are:

- Check if there is a police criminal record
- They can be given a trial time
- Make sure that they sign the Code of Conduct
- Make sure they are nice to students
- Make sure they follow the rules as well
- Check that they have a Working with Children Check
- See what they did for their last job
- Mr Foott talks to the people that worked with them last to see if they're safe people.



Once they have settled into St Agnes' they get more information and training about child safety.

Inclusion and Empowerment for all Students and Young People.



All the staff and teachers at our school help the students understand that they have a right to feel safe and secure.

The SRC play an important role in making sure we know that we have rights, including the right to be safe.
